POLICY TITLE: **Conflict of Interest Code – Carmichael Water District Finance Corporation**

POLICY NUMBER: **9210**

9210.10 The Political Reform Act, Government Code §81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 California Code of Regulations §18730, which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. It can be incorporated by reference and may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission after public notice and hearings to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations §18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference and, with the attached Appendices in which positions are designated, and in which disclosure categories are set forth, constitute the conflict of interest code of the Carmichael Water District Finance Corporation (Finance Corporation).

9210.20 Individuals holding designated positions shall file statements of economic interests with the County Clerk Recorder of the County of Sacramento, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code §81008). All statements will be retained by the County of Sacramento.

9210.30 Individuals holding designated positions shall be required to complete ethics training pursuant to Government Code §53234 through §53235.2.

APPENDIX A

PART I - DESIGNATED EMPLOYEES

* The Chief Financial Officer/Secretary may determine in writing that a particular consultant or new position, although a "designated position," is hired to perform a range of duties that is limited in scope and thus is not required to fully comply with the disclosure requirements described in this section. Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant's or new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. Such determination shall be a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and locations as this conflict of interest code.

Officials Who Manage Public Investments: Officials who manage public investments are deemed to be "statutory filers" within the meaning of Government Code Section 87200 and California Code of Regulations, Title 2, Section 18720 because they must file statement of economic interest (FPPC Form 700) pursuant to the state Political Reform Act instead of the Finance Corporation's Conflict of Interest Code. The Finance Corporation's statutory filers are:

Members of the Board of Directors
Chief Financial Officer/Secretary
Assistant Secretary

As a result, such persons are not designated in this code and are listed here for information only. An individual holding of the above-listed positions may contact the Fair Political Practices Commission ("FPPC") for assistance or written advice regarding their filing obligations if they believe that their position has been categorized incorrectly. The FPPC makes the final determination whether or not a position is covered by Government Code section 87200.

APPENDIX A

PART II - DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

1. All investments, business positions and income, (including gift cards, gifts, loans and travel payments) from sources that provide leased facilities, goods, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services (including training or consulting services) of the type utilized by the Finance Corporation if:
 - a. The business entity or business position in which the investment is held or which is the source of income is of the type which, within the last two (2) years, has contracted with the Finance Corporation; or,
 - b. The business entity or business position in which the investment is held or which is the source of income is of the type which, within the last two (2) years, has contracted to furnish supplies or services as subcontractors in any contract with the Finance Corporation.
2. All interests in real property located within the jurisdiction or within two (2) miles of the boundaries of the jurisdiction of the Finance Corporation.
3. All investments or business positions in any business entity or sources of income which are (1) private companies engaged in service(s) similar to those provided by the District or (2) entities or persons engaged in real estate development or owners of real estate, and interests in real property are disclosable if held, regardless of any contractual relationship with the Finance Corporation at any time.

APPENDIX B

All interests in real property as well as investments and business positions in business entities and income from sources which provide facilities, services, supplies, or equipment of the type utilized by the Finance Corporation, including but not limited to:

Accounting services
Appraisal services
Architectural services
Canal and pipeline maintenance services
Communications equipment and services
Computer hardware and software
Construction and building materials
Construction contractors
Custom farming services such as weed abatement, etc.
Electrical equipment, including pumping equipment
Engineering services, including hydrology services
Freight and hauling
Hardware tools and supplies
Insurance companies
Janitorial services
Meters and other water measurement equipment
Motor vehicles, heavy equipment, special vehicles and parts and services thereto
Office equipment
Pesticides and herbicides
Petroleum products
Photographic services, supplies and equipment
Pipe, valves, fittings, etc.
Printing, reproduction, record keeping, etc.
Public utilities
Pumps, motors, etc.
Real estate agents/brokers and investment firms
Safety equipment and facilities
Telemetering equipment
Title companies
Water quality testing
Water treatment equipment, supplies and services
Well drilling supplies and contractors
